1. The meeting was called to order at 10:06 AM by Jill Henry, chairperson of the Audit & Governance Committees. All committee members were present.

2. Audit Committee Discussion Issues

- Presentation of 2021 Bonadio Audit Results
 - i. Financial Statements

After approval by the Audit Committee, the report will be finalized to be approved by the FLRLBC Board of Directors. The draft report indicates an increased debt to assets ratio, an indicator of healthy finances. However, the Land Bank's funds are only enough to pay for operations in 2022 and will be seeking new funding for additional projects in the future.

The line of credit shown in the report has been paid off and going forward, payment will be due annually instead of monthly. There are no current plans to utilize the line of credit in 2022 but will solely be used on Habitat for Humanity projects if so.

There were two (2) findings within the report. The Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) reimbursement regarding Mr. McGrath's salary was not classified as revenue against the grant. To resolve this issue, the salary reimbursement and all expenditures will be coded correctly in QuickBooks to ensure proper classification. The second finding showed property valuations were higher than what they are potentially worth. Mr. McGrath stated that this audit year was the first time that they had properties still owned by the Land Bank that had significant work invested into them. Mr. McGrath reflected that investment in the property valuations. After review by the auditors, it was found that no matter what level of investment, until a project is completed it is best to estimate the value based on half of the assessed value. To resolve this finding and avoid overstating property value, estimated values will be entered as half of their assessed value at all times no matter what going forward.

Audit Committee Vote for Referral of Audit Findings to FLRLBC Board of Directors

Jill Henry made a motion and Frank Sinicropi seconded the referral of the audit findings to the FLRLBC Board of Directors. Carried 3-0

3. Governance Committee Discussion Issues
